Dear Friends,

“Linked Together We Will Make a Difference” was the theme of our 2013 Annual Meeting and Domestic Violence Awareness Month Luncheon. As I reflect on our past year accomplishments, this theme resonates with most if not all of our successes. Here are a few highlights of the activities that took place.

We provided safe, confidential shelter to 219 adults and 166 of their children for a total of 10,540 shelter nights. That’s an average of 29 individuals in our shelter every night. We provided outreach services to 1,946 victims and provided education and professional training to 3,566 people in our community.

We completed extensive renovations in our residential kitchen, replaced carpet throughout the shelter, had a facility generator installed, renovated a laundry building which also allowed us to open another bedroom for victims in need of safe shelter. With the generous gift of a local donor we were able to secure new appliances for our new laundry room which increased the number of washers and dryers that are available to our families.

Linked together we made a difference. Linked together we will continue to make a difference. We will continue to serve. We will continue to be a catalyst for change. We will continue our journey to end domestic violence in our community.

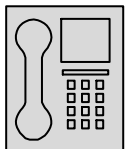

Emergency Shelter: Temporary, emergency housing for victims of domestic abuse and their children 24-hours per day, 365 days a year. We provide emergency food, hygiene items, clothing, beds & bathing facilities in an emotionally supportive and safe environment.



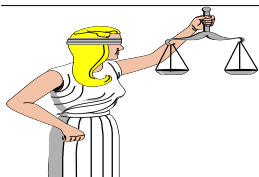
24-Hour Crisis Line: A trained staff member or volunteer answers the phone 24-hours a day, seven days a week. The hotline provides support, initial screening, safety planning and information and referral services to victims of domestic violence and anyone needing assistance.



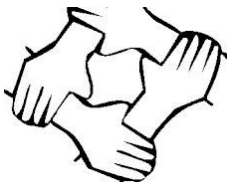
Court Advocacy: Provides support and guidance to victims of domestic violence through the injunctions for protection process, may also help with victim compensation, relocation assistance, address confidentiality.



Transitional Housing (Second Choice): Provide housing and supportive services to homeless women and children. Case management and supportive services are provided to assist residents with achieving self sufficiency and permanent housing.



Legal Program: Works with victims to provide legal representation through the injunction for protection process.



Support/education groups: Facilitated by trained advocates, victims share their feelings with others or may also request one-on-one sessions. Advocates provide information, referrals and advocacy. A confidential intake will be completed before attending any sessions.



Community Education & Professional Training: Presentations to the public are provided, both in person and through media, about domestic violence, prevention, and rehabilitation Orientation and in-service training programs provided, too.

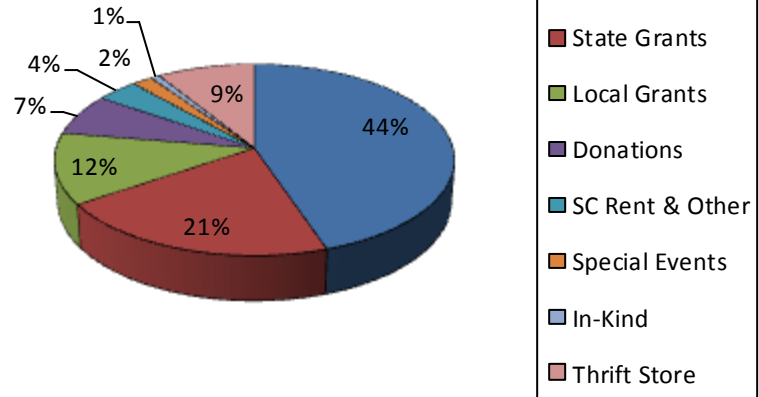

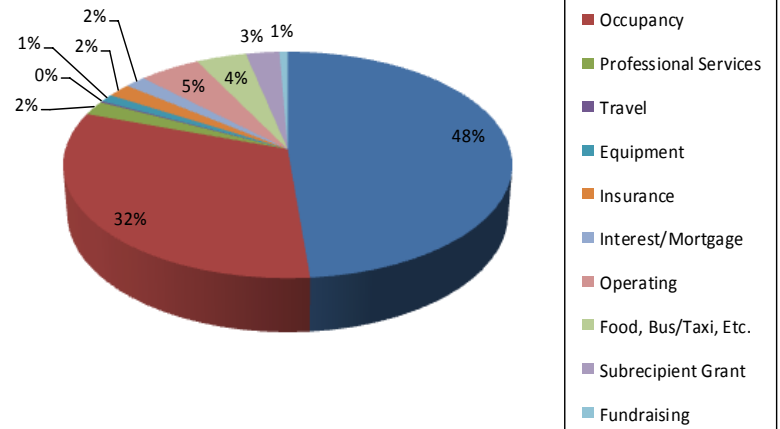
2012-2013 Revenue
